

# Elizabeth Loewy Bio

Liz Loewy is currently Co-founder and General Counsel at EverSafe, a technology company focused on the prevention of elder fraud and identity theft. Before coming to EverSafe, Liz was a prosecutor in the Manhattan District Attorney's Office under Robert M. Morgenthau and then Cyrus R. Vance, Jr. A graduate of the University of Pennsylvania and Albany Law School, Ms. Loewy headed the DA's Office's Domestic Violence Unit before becoming the founding chief of the Office's first Elder Abuse Unit, where she oversaw 18 attorneys responsible for prosecuting approximately 800 elder abuse cases, annually. In 2009, Ms. Loewy served as trial counsel in a high-profile trial involving the late Brooke Astor, after leading the investigation and successful prosecution of Mrs. Astor's son, Anthony Marshall. Ms. Loewy was a presenter at the 2015 White House Conference on Aging in Washington, DC. She has been a speaker on the topic of elder financial abuse at numerous conferences in the US and Europe, and currently serves on the National Adult Protective Services Association's Financial Exploitation Advisory Board and the Board of HelpAge USA. She is co-author of a book entitled "Financial Exploitation of the Elderly: Legal Issues, Prevention, Prosecution, Social Service Advocacy" (Civic Research Institute), and has been quoted in a number of periodicals including the NY Times, Consumer Reports, Forbes and Kiplinger and has appeared on ABC's 20/20, CNBC, ABC News and NPR.
